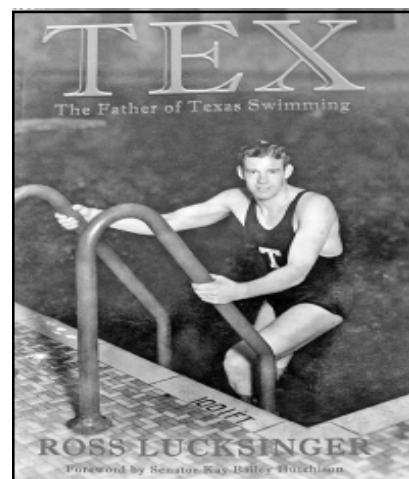

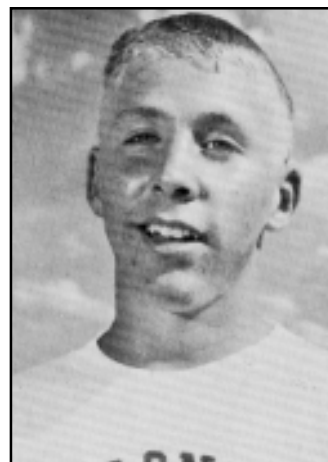


Now Available!

ATTAWAYTOGO . . . APRIL RUSSELL KUBIK!

Congratulations APRIL RUSSELL KUBIK, our 2015 ATTAWAYTOGO recipient. April began as a Hummingbird in 1970 and continued faithfully until 1985. During her years as a camper she was a campfire lighter and won lots of activity awards including the Marina Award in 1975.

She is most deserving of this award because of the 8 years she spent as a counselor for an incredible 24 terms. She spent 11 terms as a Wrangler Chief counselor and was chosen favorite counselor in 1981. Many of her summers were spent heading up water skiing and she was also a very popular Marina Officer. The summer of 1985, APRIL was the Girl's Camp activity director and in December she was a staff member for the CLH Cancun Adventure.

In the spring of 1983 APRIL married KRIS KUBIK who naturally was encouraged to work at camp that summer for 3 terms. With APRIL by his side, KRIS has served as the associate head men's swim coach at the University of Texas for the past 36 years. With APRIL cheering at almost every meet, the Longhorns

have won 11 NCAA team titles and have finished runner up 22 times.

This March the team won their 11th title in Iowa City, Iowa. APRIL also traveled to Beijing, China in 2008 when KRIS served as assistant Olympic coach. Because of APRIL's outstanding spirit and support she was awarded the prestigious Frank Erwin Award in 2010 for outstanding contributions to Texas Swimming.

APRIL comes from a loyal Camp Longhorn family. Her sisters AMBER and ASHLEY and brother ANDEE attended for many years and were popular counselors. APRIL now is a proud aunt of former camper and counselor AUBREY ELENZ and current campers REED ELENZ and ADAM and AUSTIN RUSSELL.

APRIL graduated from the University of Texas and for the past 25 years has served as a Pro Bono Coordinator for Texas Rio Grande Legal Aid. She is a former Board member of CASA of Travis County and continues her involvement with the Junior League of Austin as a sustaining member.

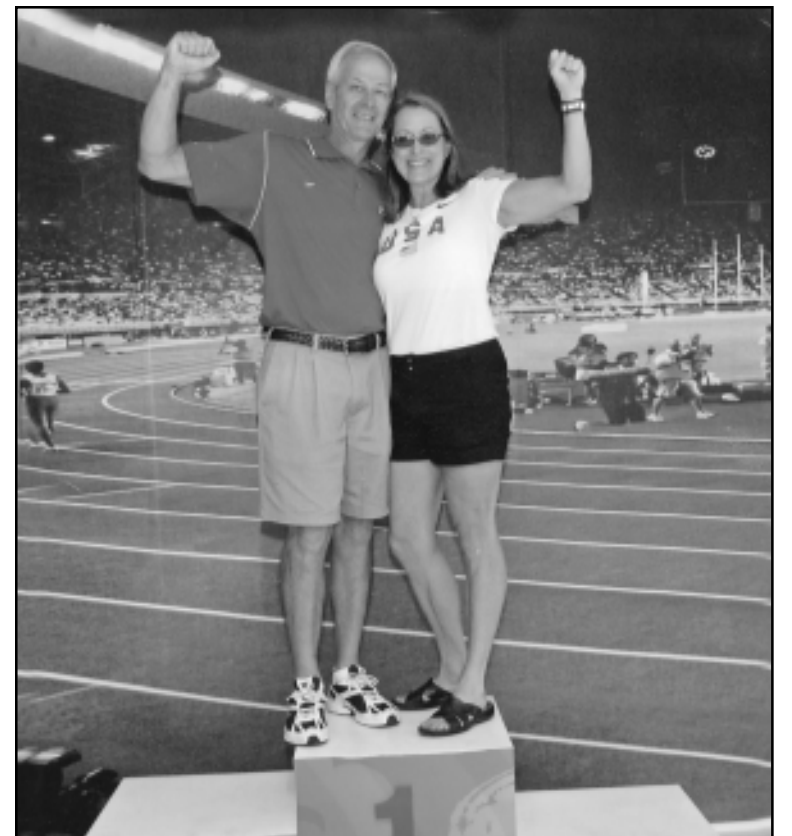

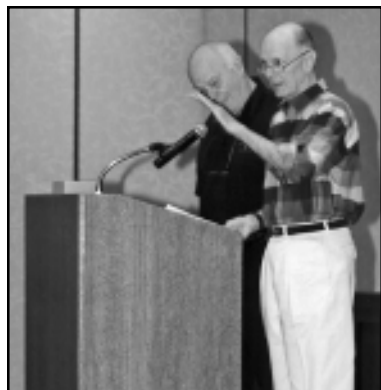

Camp creates controlled challenge for those who attend

When people notice my Camp Longhorn ring, they often ask about its meaning. When I respond that it is from my summer camp, they follow up by asking "what kind of camp?"

That is a good question. Though CLH is my camp, it was not my only camping experience. Typically, I would go to four camps per summer. I went to a large, one-week Christian camp in East Texas for nine summers. Throughout my career in the Boy Scouts, I would go with my troop to a rustic Scout camp for a week, where we would earn merit badges, prepare our own food, and stay in tents. I would also go on an additional trip, either a long backpacking trip or to the National Scout jamboree.

There were two main factors to all of this camping: I was fortunate enough to have parents willing and able to send me to these camps, and I grew up in Corsicana, a town short on summer stimuli. With my breadth of experience, I was always aware of the distinctive nature of CLH in the camping universe.

I have known about Camp for my entire life. Both sides of my family have attended for generations. Family reunions feature a daunting number of matching Longhorn rings. Our Longhorn experiences varied vastly; the two dozen of us are spread out between the camps and across decades.

My Uncle SCOTT grew up on the Inks Lake grounds, whereas my sister spent only a term in the Office at Indian Springs; my dad moved in hay bails to help build "Ranch Branch" in the seventies in the CIT program, but some of my cousins were only campers in the early 2000s. Despite the considerable differences between our experiences, there is more that unites than that divides our memories of camp.

To determine what exactly CLH is, it is helpful to consider what it is not. It is not a religious camp, driven by a mission to instill a particular ethos or mentality. We have elements of this providing the foundation for our merit system and messages of positivity and kindness, but these are not the central aim.

It is not a place to hone camping skills, like my experience in the Boy Scouts. Though we have to keep our bunks neat, bus our own tables, take turns with O.D. responsibilities, pass the bars in various activities, and go without the creature comforts of home, CLH does not try to prepare you to backpack Big Bend.

It is also not a resort camp, an extension of snooty vacation homes favored by a subset of coastal elites. It is not a sports camp, like those encouraged by schools for athletes to learn a skillset for a varsity season. Though team sports and swimming form a backbone to our activity system and frame each day, we focus on participation and the idea that everyone is a winner. Counselors reward the unathletic kid who is putting in an effort or the talented future all-star trying to spread the ball around just as much as giving out merits for great plays.

So what remains? Ultimately, I

believe Camp is a healthy place to be challenged while being supported while you meet those challenges.

For me, the challenges were social. It was the one time of the year during which I was surrounded by kids from places wildly different than Corsicana. Camp Longhorn kids were people that I knew from an early age were going to go somewhere and do something. They were kids from suburbs or nice parts of cities, who attended great schools who had parents with good jobs that cared about their education. They were kids who were certain that they would go to college, and not just because of football teams. We have those in Corsicana, but they are often the exceptions that prove the rule.

I came to camp a bit younger than my cabin in 1999. I was undersized, nerdy, a picky eater, and lacked the capacity to catch any sort of ball. The things that I excelled at during the school year did not apply to the Buzard cabin.

But each summer as a camper, I grew a bit more confident and capable. By the time we started Wrangling, I realized I had a knack for teaching and counseling. When we went on the Ranger trip, I saw that while I was comfortable--having been an Eagle Scout for some years by that point--the cool, athletic kids in my cabin who I had looked up to (and often envied for years) were challenged by the camping experiences. I realized that no matter who you are, Camp has something that will put you off-balance, but catch you when you slip.

The transition from a camper to a counselor was one of the most important of my life. In retrospect, I was not much older than my charges. But at the time, I felt as if I had crossed a great gulf into maturity. There, I learned one of the secrets of adulthood: no one knows exactly what they are doing all the time.

It takes instinct and a reliance on character as much as experience and preparation to make it when people--especially children--are dependent on you. Camp is a laboratory for that: allowing campers and counselors to be challenged by circumstances and figure out the best way to deal with them. That culture of challenge is what led me to pursue running the ropes course and rock climbing activities for a few summers, still my favorite job.

At Rhodes College, in Memphis, there were only a handful of Camp Longhorn kids. But I sought out friends who reminded me of my summers at Camp, who would continue

to challenge me. Even during law school at Harvard, I sought out people with camp experiences. On one of the first days there, I found a friendly face in a Fun-in-the-Sun shirt, ROBERT WILSON, a 4th term with whom I remain close friends.

Besides the question about what Camp Longhorn is, is the observation that I always talk about my experiences there. Not only in Austin or the other large cities of Texas, but throughout the nation and the world, I have met people with Camp Longhorn roots with whom I have had an immediate connection.

These conversations are not the insufferable "remember when" conversations which are excruciatingly dull to observers. Indeed, the odds are fairly low that you and a random Longhorn alumnus will have been at the same camp at the same time.

Instead, there are conversations about the friendships and experiences. There is something deep and ritualistic about the Longhorn connection, something that becomes engrained long before there is any awareness of the deeper value of Camp. For a Rattlesnake or a Wrangler, the idea is a place to get away from the normal aspects of life, to allow yourself to be challenged and to succeed.

I have spent my legal career in Texas criminal justices as a prosecutor. Generally, I do not see young offenders who would have had the good fortune to go to Camp Longhorn or anything like it. For our subset of society, summers are a time of growth and challenge.

But for many Texan families, summer represents a dangerous time with

unsupervised children and no structure to support them as they meet a different type of challenge. I remind myself whenever plans to keep kids in school longer are floated that my maturity was marked not by my advancement through the grades, but by the obstacles I faced and bested each summer at camp.

I still do not have a short answer for what Camp Longhorn is, but I know that our world would be much better off if each person could experience it.

JIM KINGMAN, what a special, special story . . . about four different kinds of camps and their challenges that you attended each summer during your childhood years . . . church, scout, backpacking and CLH. Each had it's own identity and each had such positive influences on you. You are a true Longhorn Man and this writing expresses it! JIM, who grew up in Corsicana, TX, was a Camper 5 years plus one mini camp and 5 years as a Counselor, all at Indian Springs. He has recently moved to Victoria, TX and will be an Assistant District Attorney in the Felony Division of the Victoria County District Attorney's Office. JIM was a Campfire Lighter in 2003 and as a Counselor some of his titles included Activities Director, Ropes Director, Funtastics Director, Marine General, Ranger Counselor. He graduated from Rhodes College in Memphis, TN and Harvard Law School. We thank you again, JIM, for your story and we hope someday soon you can take time from your busy schedule and give mini-camp a whirl again! ATTAWAYTOGO, JIM KINGMAN!

MARK TITUS was right across, and I was left across. That year was a turning point in my life. So many decisions in my life were influenced by Camp Longhorn. - I attended Texas Tech because of AMY SCOTT FORTENBERRY, TONY BARNARD, LACI MORRISON and several others that I met at CLH. I told myself that I was going to be there as long as I could go.

DEBRA was at camp for 5 or 6 years. JOHN was at camp 8 or 9 years. He spent a great deal of time out at Hoss with DAVE BAUER. After that first year, I kept spending more of my summers at camp. Added 3rd Term the 2nd year, then added 2nd Term the 3rd year. Although it has been several years since I've been to camp, the advent of Facebook, LinkedIn and singing "TAPS" to my daughter has kept me at camp year after year the last few years. Not a week goes by without CLH being in my life.

Just a few months ago, I had a friend request. Do I know PABLO MURRA it asked? He was one of my marines in 1990 as I was General Goofy and AMY SCOTT FORTENBERRY was General Munchkin. Both fitting names I think. That was the last time I saw him at camp. WOW, was that 25 years ago?

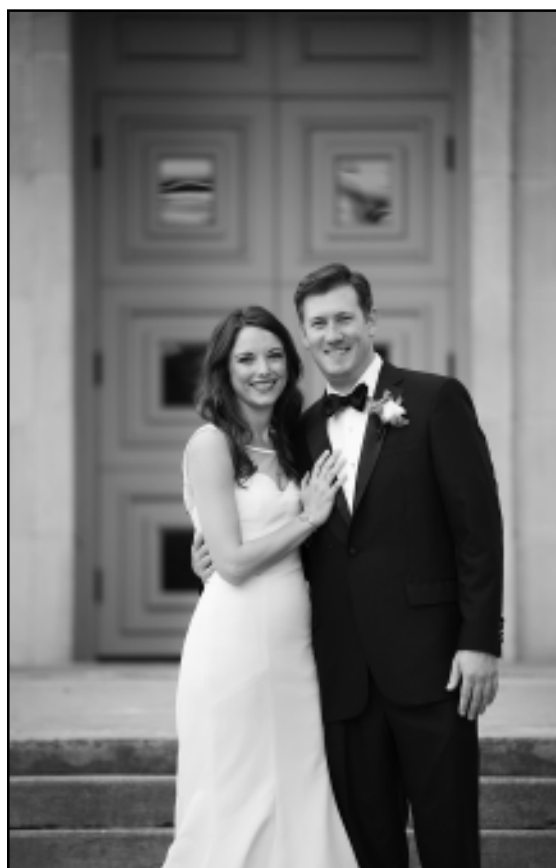

How the war shaped Camp Longhorn

This summer is a big one; our daughter will be a Marina. I'm so jealous. It's hard to believe it's been thirty-six summers since SCOTT JOHNSON and BILL KINGMAN stormed the Shark cabin and informed us that we were now "Marines."

I remember as a younger camper watching the older guys being initiated in the mud and wearing those olive green shirts with the CLH Marine logo. I couldn't wait for that summer when I would join the ranks and I was not disappointed.

It remains as one of my favorite summers and the shirt is still in my closet. We never considered the reason or origin of the CLH Marines; we just knew it was a blast.

I recently read ROSS LUCKSINGER's book about his grandfather TEX. I cannot recommend it highly enough. I learned so many things about TEX and the history of Camp Longhorn from ROSS' incredibly well done work. I gained a totally new perspective on not only the Camp but also the extraordinary group of men and women who made it a reality.

We know that TEX and PAT started CLH in 1939 with a single camper. Two and a half years later the United States entered WWII putting things on an indefinite hold. The core of TEX's team went to war. BOB TARLTON became a radio operator in North Africa, and Italy. FRANK WITHERS, TEX's cousin and known to all of us as ZARK, joined the Army and fought in the infamous Battle of the Bulge. BOB HUDSON fought in the Philippines and BILL JOHNSON fought heroically on Iwo Jima with the Marines.

Ironically most men in the Navy didn't know how to swim and TEX was recruited to teach them. He later was tasked with training a new group of elite soldiers for Underwater Demolition Teams (UDTs), which later became the Navy Seals. What I wouldn't give to have an afternoon with them now.

I remember ZARK as quiet but have come to appreciate his incredible contribution to the creation of the facilities (he came up with the Old Facefull idea using old refrigerator coils). BOB TARLTON was a brilliant storyteller and very kind man. I didn't know BOB as well because he ran the girl's camp and I knew to never stray past the Super Slide but my sisters loved him. BILL JOHNSON was a hero to me. He was JOHN WAYNE in orange shorts, tall, handsome and could do anything. It never occurred to me to ask how he lost that finger and none of them ever mentioned their experiences in the War.

Camp Longhorn reopened in 1946 forever changed by the War. The original Blob was an Army surplus underground gas tank liner. The Chow Hall trays and bunks were Army surplus as well. ROSS explains in his book that, "A six-wheeled, six wheel-drive Burma truck cleared boulders and trees to make room for an air strip and a road leading to camp. At the end of the term the boys, if they'd been good, earned rifles, bayonets, gas masks, canteens and

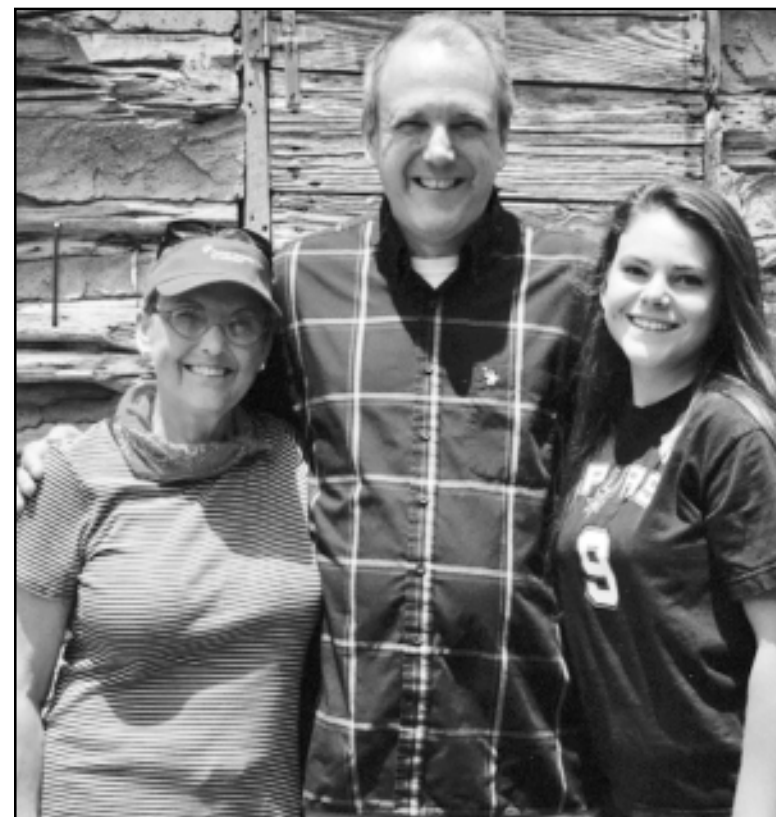
foxhole shovels to take-home."

Daily inspections, footlockers, KP, OD in and out and the Marines were all brought back from their time overseas. Our daughter will be a Marina this summer and she will love it. I'll make sure she knows something about the amazing men behind Camp's most enduring traditions.

Camp Longhorn, with deference to Disneyland, is the happiest place on earth but wouldn't exist had it not been for an incredible group of true American heroes.

What's Cookin'?

From the kitchen of Alumni JUDY ROUNDTREE! She is involved in the Merit Store and also Office at Indian Springs and husband (and retired coach) JIM goes on the CLH Ranger trips during the summer. JIM, JUDY and all their children have been involved with Camp Longhorn for many years. We thank you, JUDY, for some delicious sounding recipes!

CHICKEN SALAD

4 chicken breasts, boiled, cooled and shredded (but not too small)
3 hard cooked eggs, chopped
1 cup chopped celery
1 cup bacon, cooked and crumbled
1/2 cup sweet pickle relish
1/2 cup mayonnaise
Salt and pepper to taste

Combine ingredients adding mayonnaise last. Gently fold in. Add more mayonnaise if for sandwiches.

BROCCOLI CORNBREAD

1 box yellow jiffy cornbread mix
1 - 10 oz. box frozen chopped broccoli, thawed
1/2 cup cottage cheese
2 eggs
1/2 cup (1 stick) softened margarine (not melted)

Mix all ingredients together. Batter will be thick. Preheat oven to 350. Pour into a round 9-inch glass pie plate and bake for about 50 minutes.

EASY DESSERT

Yellow sheet cake
Small box vanilla pudding
12 oz. Cool Whip
Strawberries, Kiwi, Bananas, Blueberries

Cut cake into bite size squares. I baked a box yellow cake in a 13 x 9 pan and let cool. You could also use a bought angel food cake if you like that better. Prepare vanilla pudding according to box directions then add cool whip, mix until smooth. Layer glass dish (I used a trifle bowl) with cake bites in the bottom. Cover with 1/2 of the pudding mixture then top with fruit. Use any fruit that you like. I used strawberries, kiwi, bananas (only use bananas in the middle so they are covered) & blueberries. Be sure to mix the colors of the fruit so it is pretty from the outside of the glass bowl. Repeat layers of cake, pudding & fruit. Cover and refrigerate.

CABBAGE SOUP

1 - 1 1/2 lbs. hamburger meat
1 tsp. minced garlic (I use already prepared in jar)
1 large onion, chopped
1 head cabbage, chopped
1 - 14.5 oz. can diced tomatoes
1 can Rotel tomatoes
1 - 8 oz. can tomato sauce
1 c. water
1 t. pepper
1 t. salt

Saute hamburger meat & garlic (drain). Place chopped cabbage, onion, tomatoes, Rotel tomatoes, tomato sauce, water, salt & pepper in either a crock pot or a large soup pot on the stove. Place hamburger/garlic mixture on top. Cook in crock pot on low for 8 hours. If cooking on top of stove cook on low until cabbage is tender.
